INTERNAL CLUB COMPETITION RULES 2026

- 1. All competitions shall be played under Bowls England laws of the game/club unless otherwise stated.
- 2. All rounds will have fixed closing dates and these must be kept to. Failure to do so may lead to expulsion from that competition.
- 3. There will be fixed dates for each round of the Handicapped Pairs competition.
- 4. Both sets of players are responsible for arranging their matches.
- 5. The player on top is to arrange the marker, choose the rink and enter the date and time in the rink diary.
- 6. If a competitor is happy to be scratched, for whatever reason, the other party(s) will go through to the next round. However, all attempts to complete the round should be made by both sides. Please inform the Competition Secretary on or before the final date of that round if one party is happy to be scratched. Failure to do so could result in both parties being scratched.
- 7. Players toss for the mat. The final score card must be signed by the players or skip, as appropriate, and handed to the Competition Secretary.
- 8. Any dispute should be recorded on the score card and a written statement of the issue handed to the Competition Secretary within 24 hours of the match. A final decision will be given by the Competition Secretary or sub committee.

PLEASE NOTE

If you are fortunate enough to make it to the final of any competition you enter, you will play an average of 5 games for each competition.

Dates will be given for each round to be completed by with the exception of the handicapped pairs (George W. Gibson) which will have the following fixed dates - Round 1 to be played on Friday 19th June, Quarter Finals to be played on Friday 24th July and the Semi Finals to be played on Friday 28th August.
